My Three Big Takeaways

1. None of it matters if they don't follow Jesus. (Homeschooling is not what saves our kids.)
2. I am teaching my child, not the curriculum. (Be a student of your children.)
3. Know my must haves – everything else is added bonus. (Take this to the Lord in prayer, every year as you plan, weekly as you plan, daily in the thick of it. Trust Him!)
